School Attendance

All schools are obliged to keep a record of pupil absences and reasons for absences under the Education (Welfare) Act 2000.

- Responsibility of Parents: Under the Education (Welfare) Act 2000 parents must inform the school if their child is absent from school and the reason for the absence.
 - Responsibility of the School: Schools are obliged to keep a register of the pupils attending the school. They must also maintain attendance records for all pupils and inform the Educational Welfare Services if a child is absent for more than 20 days in a school year. The Principal must also inform the Educational Welfare Services if a student has an attendance problem.

Reminders

- If you wish to take out the Pupil Personal Insurance on your child please send in the form and money to Lisa by Friday.
 - 2. Children should be on time for school.
 - 3. Opening/Closing time: The Board of Management does not accept responsibility for pupils on the school grounds before the official opening time of the school at 9.00am. School finishes each day at 2.40pm. Parents who wish to have their children collected from school should make sure the person collecting them is at the school at 2.40pm as the school cannot be responsible for looking after children after the official closing time of 2.40pm.
- 4. Children should not be on the school grounds before/after official school time or during weekends.
 - 5. Children going home during the day must have a written note from a parent/guardian. Children in 3rd class are not allowed to walk home alone during the day.
