- A. ChatBudi: Ensure that your children have ChatBudi. This is someone over 18 years of age that a child trusts and feels comfortable talking to about suspicious online activities.
- B. Reassurance: Speak to your children about online dangers and create awareness of the importance to chat about any worries or unusual behaviour that may be happening online.
 - C. Online Stranger Danger: Ensure your children only contact people online that they know in the real world.
- D. Age Appropriateness: Ensure all internet connected devices are restricted to age suitable content.
