Whole School Evaluation

As you are all aware, there was a Whole School Evaluation of the school recently. Three inspectors from the Department of Education spent four days with us visiting classes, looking at policies, plans and standardised test results. They also conducted questionnaires with pupils in 4th/6th classes, parents and staff. They met with representatives of the Parents Association, the Board of Management and all staff members. They also met with the Student Council, Green Schools Committee, Student Bloggers, Junior Librarians, Junior Referees and Playground Leaders.

The inspectors provided feedback to the Board of Management and Staff last Wednesday. We were thrilled and delighted that their report was very, very positive. They reported that the quality of Teaching and Learning in the school was Very Good; they spoke about the management of pupils being a significant strength in the school and of the exemplary school garden. They said that 100% of parents who returned the questionnaires felt welcome in the school. A written report will be issued and will be available on the website of the Department of Education and Skills and on our school website in due course. We are all very, very proud of the excellent evaluation.
