Education Welfare Services

Every school must notify the Education Welfare Services if pupils miss 20 or more days from school during the year. If your child misses many days from school we must let you know and will notify you usually by letter.

Pupils who miss 20 consecutive days from school MUST be taken off the roll in accordance with Circular 28/2013 (p3) from the Department of Education and Skills which states: "a pupil must be struck off the Roll Book (Leabhar Rolla) as soon as (i) the teacher becomes aware that the pupils has left the school or (ii) on the first Monday following an absence of 20 consecutive school days. However, Section 20 of the Education (Welfare Act) 2000 requires that a child's name must remain on the school Register (Clárleabhar) until such time as the Principal receives the required notification from another school (or from the NEWB) in accordance with the Act"
