### **Swimming**

Swimming for 3rd class pupils starts Tuesday week (22nd January). Aquatics is part of the PE Curriculum and the swimming lessons will take the place of PE for the next 8 weeks. The cost is €5 per session or €40 for the 8 sessions. This is excellent value and includes the cost of bus hire, pool hire and tuition.

#### Health Issues

Unfortunately this is the time of year where bugs and germs thrive—there has been lots of sickness last week with heavy colds, tummy bugs and pupils generally feeling unwell. If your child complains about being unwell in school we will ring you at the number you have given us. Please check your children's hair regularly for head lice. If your child has a rash or itchy skin please get it checked out as certain conditions including scabies are highly contagious.

#### Social, Personal, Health Education

SPHE is one of the subjects on the primary school curriculum. Children learn about "Myself, Myself & Others, Myself & the Wider World". The SPHE curriculum helps children understand and accept themselves as unique individuals. It contributes to the development of personal skills—children learning how to manage their feelings, resolve conflicts and how to cope with new and demanding situations. The SPHE curriculum covers a wide range of issues including substance misuse, relationships, sexuality, child abuse prevention, prejudice and discrimination. The Stay Safe programme and relationships and Sexuality programme are taught as part of the SPHE curriculum (see letter overleaf)

#### Carambola

Carambola (our school lunch providers) spent 2 days in the school last week doing food tasting with the children. This was a great success. #### Dear Parents/Guardians.

We will be teaching the Relationship and Sexuality Education (RSE) programme as part of the SPHE Curriculum in our school over the next few months. RSE teaches children about relationships, sexuality and their own growth and development. Our RSE policy is on the school website <a href="https://www.stthomas.ie">www.stthomas.ie</a> The sensitive elements of the RSE programme are covered under Strand Units Growing and Changing and Taking Care of My Body. The following topics will be completed in the coming weeks. All lessons are age appropriate.

Bodily Changes (3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> class)

Healthy Eating, Personal Hygiene, Exercise

Keeping Safe

**Expressing Feelings and Emotions** 

Making Healthy and Responsible Decisions

Forming Friendships

Introduction to puberty and changes (3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> class)

Stages and sequence of development of the human baby from conception to birth (3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> class)

Changes that occur in boys and girls with the onset of puberty (5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> class)\*

Reproductive system of male/female adults (5<sup>th</sup> / 6<sup>th</sup> class)\*

Understanding sexual intercourse, conception and birth within the context of a committed loving relationship ( $5^{th}$  /  $6^{th}$  class) \*

The school acknowledges you have the primary responsibility for educating your children about growing and changing. \*During the week of  $11^{th}$  February - Accord facilitators will present the sensitive areas of the programme to pupils in  $5^{th}$  and  $6^{th}$  classes. There will be a meeting for parents in the school beforehand to meet with the facilitators who will outline the content to you.

If you have any queries or would like to discuss or clarify what will be covered during RSE, please contact the class teacher, Eimer O Leary (SPHE Co-ordinator) or myself.

Following discussion with the class teacher, if you wish for your child to "opt out" of the lessons dealing with the sensitive aspects of the RSE programme, this must put this in writing to the school principal outlining the reasons for doing so. The child will be accommodated in another teacher's classroom in the school. The school will take no responsibility for what the child may hear from other pupils following on from the teaching of the lessons e.g. in the yard.
