Attendance

We are obliged to notify the Education Welfare Services Tusla, when a pupil is absent for 20 days of school—even when the absences are explained. The school will notify parents when a child is absent for 15 and 20 days.

MSCC Entrance Assessment

Entrance Assessments take place in Mount Seskin on Friday from 9.00—12.00. All pupils who have registered for 1st Year can attend for these assessments. The tests are designed to provide information on your child's ability and skills. They are not used to decide which class your child goes into as they operate a Mixed Ability class setting. Pupils cannot fail any of these tests, they are just to let the College know what stage they are at in their learning. There is NO Irish exam. Pupils will need to bring a pencil and rubber. They will have a short break in the morning. Pupils will go to Mount Seskin directly from home for 9.00am.

They will be collected from there at 12.00 and accompanied back to school.

It is a **NORMAL** school day for <u>all 6th class pupils</u> and they will continue with regular class on their return.
