Meeting Teachers

If you need to speak with your child's teacher, please make an appointment with her through the school journal or ring the office on 01 4526555. Teachers cannot speak with parents without an appointment as supervision of classes must be organised in advance.

School Attendance

All schools are obliged to keep a record of pupil absences and reasons for absences under the Education (Welfare) Act 2000.

- Responsibility of parents: Under the Education (Welfare) Act 2000 parents must inform the school if their child is absent from school and the reason for the absence. Parents are asked to explain pupil absences from school in writing. TUSLA strongly advises against taking children out of school to go on holiday during term time.
- **Responsibility of the school**: Schools are obliged to keep a register of the pupils attending the school. They must also maintain attendance records for all pupils and inform the Educational Welfare Services (TUSLA) if a child is absent for more than 20 days in a school year. The principal must also inform the Educational Welfare Services if a student has an attendance problem.
