## Standardised Testing

The annual standardised testing in Maths and Literacy will take place this year. While standardised tests were not administered during the 2019/20 school year due to the school closures as a result of the COVID-19 panedemic, these tests will be administered as normal for this school year.

The results can help schools to evaluate progress in literacy and numeracy, can help to pinpoint areas for improvement and will support teachers in ensuring that literacy and numeracy learning experiences meet pupils' needs.

We understand that the school closures have had a significant impact on teaching and learning, which may be reflected in the standardised test results for primary schools this year and we would like to stress that there is absolutely no need for children to be worried about these tests.

Testing will take place tomorrow and next week.

# Relationships & Sexuality Education Programme

Teachers will be teaching the sensitive lessons of the RSE programme from next week. The curriculum by NCCA will be followed as published, and will be taught from 3rd to 6th class. All resources used will be in keeping with the ethos of the school and the policy, and will reflect the developmental needs of the child. Each class teacher will teach the content for their class level. If a parent wishes to take their child out of the lessons on the sensitive issues they must put this in writing with their reasons for doing so to the school principal.
