COVID

With just over two weeks to go until the Christmas Holidays, we are very aware of the continued (and unfortunately increasing) threat that Covid-19 presents to our school and community. It is the principal aim of everyone at St Thomas' SNS that all children are welcome and safe here. We want to work with families so that the best possible environment is created so that your children can learn, feel safe and be the best version of themselves. This is always the main objective of the school.

In relation to the Covid measures of the last two years the school has implemented them to the highest standard possible. We want to reassure you all that no child will be refused entry to the school for not wearing a face covering. Having the children in school happy and learning is our main aim while trying to follow HSE/Government guidelines to keep the children and our community safe. We will be taking an understanding approach to helping you and your children overcome any difficulties you may have.

We will be respectful and mindful of all pupils and parents and would be grateful if you could be patient with the school as we continue to navigate through this difficult time.

Covid HSE Advice

Please see a quick summary of the updated Quick isolation Guide from the HSE. This may prove very helpful for parents/ guardians when determining the course of action you should take in lots of different situations:

• If your child has any symptoms of Covid please keep them at home.

If there is a positive PCR test in your household, your kindly asked to contact me to inform me (this is not obligatory). You can call/ email the office and I`ll get back to you as soon as possible. With your permission, I will contact the parents/ guardians of the children in your child`s pod to let them know there has been a positive case at that pod. I will do so via a text and a letter which will be emailed to you shortly afterwards. Please ensure your contact details are up to date. If I contact you it will be to share details with you as to how you can order 3 free antigen tests. If your child is not showing any symptoms , they may come to school. However, if they develop symptoms, they must stay at home and you should book them a PCR test. If another child from a different pod in the class receives a positive PCR test, all parents/ guardians will be notified by text and email.
