# Arrivals/Dismissals

# Lifting of Covid Restrictions

Please remember the measures that NPHET has recommended:

- Masks Optional—there is no longer a requirement for either staff or pupils to wear masks in school
- Cleaning regimes will continue as they are.
- **PODS/Bubbles**—there is no longer a requirement for PODS/bubbles in school.
- Visitors are allowed back in the school by appointment
- If a staff/pupil is sick or showing any symptoms of Covid they should remain at home. The HSE will continue with the supply of antigen testing where necessary. - Hand Hygiene will continue with the sanitising and hand washing procedures.
- Singing can take place indoors. There will be a return to PE in the hall.

Critical components of the school's response plan in relation to Covid19 will continue to apply—isolation if systematic or if there is a positive Covid19 test, hand washing, respiratory hygiene and ventilation.
